Operation Christmas Child







This coming month I am celebrating a little over 8 years at Cypress. That has caused me to pause and take stock of where things have gone well (been a lot of those), and of course, areas where things could have gone better (likewise, a few of those).



But over the past years, so many things have changed while other things have remained the same. It made me think of a wonderful little song that my children learned. When our family would take a road trip we would play "Psalty" songs on the cassette player in the car (yep, before the days of CD's...but we were excited to have outgrown 8 track tapes). One of my favorite songs had the following lyrics:

Welcome to the family
We're glad that you have come
To share your life with us
As we grow in love and
May we always be to you
What God would have us be
A family always there
To be strong and to lean on,

More with each day
May words of love be on our lips
In everything we say
May the Spirit melt our hearts
And teach us how to pray
That we might be a true family

As I remembered those words I thought they are not just words for a child, but for adults as well as they speak to the life of a church. We grow together, we share our lives together, we learn to love each other and God, and we learn to lean on each other. This past month was very tough as we watched yet more loved ones pass away. But in one week, we had not only a death but also a wedding AND a baptism. The beginning of earthly life, the transition to marriage, and the passing away of life. As a church, we have laughed with those silly events that happen in all of our lives, we have watched the transitions of people as they have come and gone to school, college and off to careers, we have seen Bible studies that have transformed lives, and we have watched the Spirit come to work on the Spirit's terms.

You see, for those that just worship on Sunday morning, or perhaps even less often, they frequently miss the work of the FAMILY of God. There is nothing that can compare to the laughter of working with others in the kitchen ...especially in the tight quarters of the dish room with a wet rag in tow. There is a special bond as folks powerwash the sidewalks or upgrade an office. And it goes over the top when someone delivers flowers to a shut-in, and takes some time to hear stories about their past or about their families. It is about being the family of God, in good times and in bad, at the start of life, during the highlights of life, and even the end of this earthly life. It is being part of a family that honestly cares and loves.

<u>Church School</u> is held on Wednesday evenings starting with dinner at 6 PM and classes in "The Story" for all ages.

Christian Education Current Events

<u>Kids' Worship</u> happens on Sunday mornings. The children attend worship through the Children's Message then proceed to CE 1, Rms. 2&3 for a continued worship experience.

<u>Confirmation Class</u> is being conducted every Tuesday from 4:15-5:15 PM. There are 6 boys in the class and we are off to a great start using "Crossings" from Logos. This is a study of crossing from "childhood" understanding of the Bible, Presbyterianism, the creeds, and CLPC to becoming a "communicant member", with all the rights and privileges.

<u>Women's Circles</u> meet at three different times. There is Martha Circle which meets in members homes @ 9:30 AM; Esther Circle which meets in Fellowship Hall @ 12:30 PM. Both these circles meet on the 2nd <u>Tuesday</u> of each month, Sept. through May. The third circle, Eve, meets in members homes @ 7:30 PM the 2nd <u>Thursday</u>. All circles are studying "An Abiding Hope: The Presence of God in Exodus and Deuteronomy". Every woman <u>attending</u> CLPC is invited to attend the circle of their choice. <u>Chick Flick Night</u> takes place on the 3rd Friday of the month. It begins with "themed dinner" in Fellowship Hall, then moves to the chapel for dessert and the agreed upon movie. After the movie is discussion on what the movie has to do with us as Christian women and our lives today. The cost for dinner and the movie is \$5.00. Good food, great fun, stimulating discussion. All <u>women</u> are invited, just let Amy Cottrell know so she counts you in for dinner.

They will perform for you at the Fall Festival with a song, "God is Bigger than the Boogieman".


PICTORIAL DIRECTORY

forthcoming, so listen during announcements and read your e-Courier!




STEPHEN MINISTRY All Roads Lead To
